Free Smoke Alarms!

The Clinton Township Division of Fire has a goal for all residents to have operable smoke alarms in their home. The Division has partnered with the American Red Cross to offer Free Smoke Alarms and installation. If you need smoke alarms or if your smoke alarms are over 10 years old the Division will send a crew to install up to 2 free smoke alarms.
