

If you ever called into our office, then you most likely have spoken to Cassidy, our Records Technician. She handles a variety of calls and assists residents with obtaining information. Cassidy states, "This time of the year especially, everyone can be a target of a potential scam and the

scammers employ various tactics to catch us off-guard". She suggests staying informed is the best tactic we have to become aware of common scams and you can start by:

- Stop. Check it out!
- Make sure to identify phone numbers, check for licensed and insured proof
- Check with someone you trust before giving out your personal, healthcare, and financial information



- Read your monthly statements and check your credit card
- Shred documents with personal information & use strong online passwords (NOT your pets name!)
- Ignore, ignore, ignore! If you get spam calls hang up & block numbers/emails
- If you believe you are a victim of a scammer, or would like to report a scam, you will need to complete the consumer complaint form through the Office of the Ohio Attorney General Dave Yost at: https://www.ohioattorneygeneral.gov/about-AG/contact/report-ascam

Why trick or treat isn't always on Halloween in Columbus?



Many communities opt to use the recommendations from MORPC (Mid Ohio Regional Planning Commission). Local government members support a unified trick-or-treat date for the region.

When Halloween, October 31, falls on a Friday, Saturday, or Sunday, Trick or Treat is held the Thursday prior to October 31.

When October 31 falls on a Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, or Thursday,

Trick or Treat is held on October 31.

THIS YEAR TRICK-OR-TREAT IS MON-DAY, OCTOBER 31 FROM 6PM - 8PM

Local communities maintain the authority to change or keep their trick-ortreat date and time. In the event of inclement weather, the recommended date will likely not change.

If you are traveling

- Get automatic timers for your lights/tv/radio so it looks like someone is home.
- Have your mail/newspaper delivery stopped. If it piles up, it's a sure sign you're gone.
- Be extra cautious about locking doors and windows when you leave, even for short periods of time.

If you are shopping

- · Stay alert and be aware of your surroundings.
- Avoid carrying large amounts of cash; pay with credit cards/check whenever possible.
- Do not overload yourself with packages; purses, or wallets. Hold items close to your body when handling; use inside coat pockets or front pants pockets.

Protect your vehicle

- Always lock your vehicle and store all items out of sight.
- Help prevent your vehicle from being stolen by using anti-theft devices.
- Universal steering wheel brake lock Aims to make your vehicle inoperable while parked and works by attaching to your car's OBD2 port and tells the location of the vehicle, if your car is stolen.
- A secondary car alarm, kill switch, or tracking system paired with a deterrent such as a wheel lock can help prevent your car from being stolen.

Fall and Winter

It's that time of year already! We are preparing for leaf pick up and before your know it, plowing snow again!



The Public Works crew will be looking out for raked leaves and start pick up typically around the end of October through the second week of December. Please make sure you check www.ClintonTownship.org and our Facebook page for the last pick-up date. Remember:

- ⇒ Leaves should be raked into a pile next to curb or berm. Piles can be stretched out along your property.
- ⇒ Keep out foreign objects such as cans, bottles and other trash.
- ⇒ Please do not mix brush and sticks in with leaves; this could clog the leaf vacuum and hinder progress.
- ⇒ Please do not pile leaves on top of catch basin drains.

Please do not mix in yard waste with leaves, such as flowers, garden waste, bean pods and stalks. These types of yard waste should be bagged as yard waste and put out for trash pickup.

*****Snow plow safety tips*****

- ⇒ Do not ever try to pass a snow plow. Even if you have a four-wheel drive, let the snowplow do its job before you try to pass it.
- Follow at a safe distance. Snow plows may need to stop or swerve abruptly to avoid obstacles, including stranded cars.
- ⇒ Keep your tailpipe clear. It only takes a matter of minutes for carbon monoxide to reach lethal levels!

Fire Chief Fraley is urging everyone to help protect and keep your home safe by:



- ⇒ Installing smoke and carbon monoxide detectors and check batteries
- ⇒ Test/check all fire extinguishers
- ⇒ Plan a family escape route (Day and Night procedures) and practice drills
- Clean Dryer vents
- Clean Furnace
- Clean fireplace/Chimney
- Check to make sure all windows/doors open and close correctly
- Check all wires/cords/for damage (unplug when not in use)
- Store extra batteries in a safe way/place
- Test and clean space heaters often
- ⇒ Create an emergency contact list and display it in a main area
- ⇒ Make sure your house number is visible from the street to make it easy for first responders to find you in case of an emergency.

In February of this year, the **Township** was noti-



fied by the Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) that our application was selected for award through the Township Stimulus Program in the amount of \$250,000. Clinton Township was one of eight Townships to receive this maximum award amount. The money will be utilized to build sidewalks along the southside of Elmore Ave. from Township boundaries to Cleveland Ave. We are working with the County Engineers office with a completion date in 2023.
