New Flock Cameras Assists with Arrests

Clinton Township Police Department began utilizing the Flock system with most of the Central Ohio Communities around the beginning of 2023. The Flock camera location alerts officers on patrol instantly when a vehicle alerts to a particular location so officers can begin to look for the vehicle quickly.

The Flock system is an ALPR, (Automatic License Plate Reader), that only captures a license plate or temporary registration. These cameras read the license plates of vehicles passing by the camera and check it for missing, wanted persons, and/or stolen vehicles. These do not provide any information other than for vehicles that are on wanted lists by police agencies or stolen vehicles entered in to national police data bases. Officers then check the license plate through a state law enforcement data base to get the vehicle information and to verify that it is a stolen vehicle or is wanted in connection with a wanted person.

The flock system has assisted in officers recovering stolen vehicles and missing persons in Clinton Township within the last 12 months, and assisted in other agencies investigating stolen vehicles and persons with serious felony warrants.

Some data for the Flock system for the time period of September 11, 20223 to October 11-2023. For the listed time period 1,433,014 vehicles passed by the Flock cameras that's approximately 47,767 vehicles per day. For the same time period we received 99 Stolen vehicle hits and 103 wanted persons alerts. Since implementing this system Clinton Township officers have had a dramatic increase in pursuits of these stolen vehicles that many have had to be cancelled do to high speed and reckless operation of the suspects.

The Clinton Township Division of Fire Earns a Class 2 ISO Rating

The Clinton Township Division of Fire has recently earned a Class 2 Public Protection Classification (PPC) rating by the Insurance Services Office (ISO). This is the second highest possible PPC rating for fire department protection services. This rating places the Clinton Township Division of Fire in the top 4% of all fire departments throughout



the U.S. The Division's new rating, which is an improvement from its previous Class 3 designation from 2018, will take effect on November 1, 2023.

This review was conducted in May of 2023 by ISO staff with site visits for an in-depth review of department operations including the following:

- **Emergency Communications**
- Water Supply
- **Training**
- **Response Times**
- Automatic and Mutual Aid Agreements
- Maintenance
- Community Risk Reduction

The scale of a PPC rating ranges from 1-10, with Class 10 being no protection offered. To improve from Class 3 to Class 2 is a major improvement not only for our department but also our community. Insurance companies and economic developers use the PPC ratings to gauge the protection offered in a community. The residents of Clinton Township should know that their fire department is continuously seeking ways to improve responses and reduce the risk of fires or other emergencies in their community.


Candy Packaging 2023! Thursday, December 14th

An Update From Code Compliance Officer Dan Quigley

Code Compliance Cases for 2023

So far during calendar year 2023 there have been 97 code compliance cases investigated. These cases range from overgrown yards to abandoned homes. Several cases of note include the following:

3806 Walford Street – The homeowner passed away in 2019 and no heirs claimed the property. The home fell into disrepair and unknown people moved onto the property creating a health and safety issue. The property has been cleaned up and the home has been deemed unsafe and will be torn down in the next several months.

3713 Sale Road – The homeowner passed away leaving no one to inherit the property. Due to unpaid property taxes the home has been foreclosed on. However, three people began living in the home resulting in numerous code violations and police calls for service and in general creating a nuisance to the community. This home too was found to be unsafe and through a cooperative effort of the Police, Fire, Public Works, and Code Enforcement the people were relocated, and the home boarded up pending the Sheriffs auction.

<u>Lot at Audrey</u> — Vacant lot overgrown, Public Works cut the lot after a resolution was passed by the township under O.R.C.

505.87, a statement of all costs incurred in providing for the abatement was reported to the auditor's



It should be noted that there are statutory regulations that must be followed before enforcement action can take place. The Walford property took 7 months before the township was presented with a resolution to begin cleanup in conjunction with Central Ohio Community Improvement Corporation (COCIC).

The Sale Road property took 9 months before it was foreclosed on by the Franklin County treasures office and the persons living in the home removed. Having said that most residents voluntarily comply with the notices sent to them about the violations.
