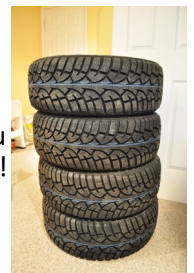

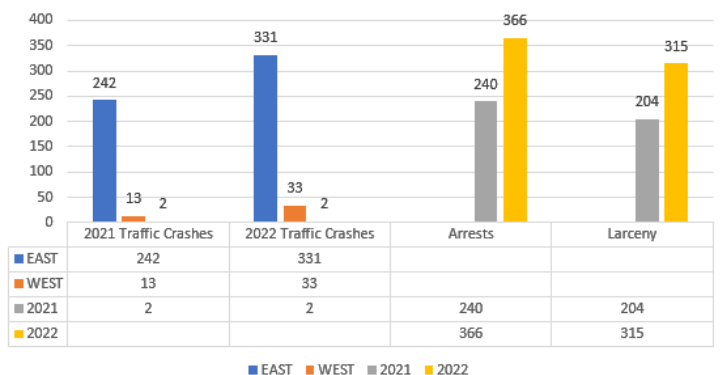

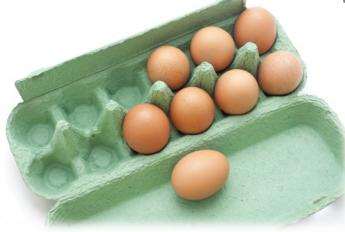

Remember when... If you wanted your egg over-easy and the yolk busted, you started over and perhaps gave the busted one to the dog? These days, we are most likely going to just deal with the busted egg and eat it! More conversations these days include the ever-increasing cost of eggs and many people are flocking to the idea of

getting their own chickens! In case you are wondering, there are many pros and cons to raising chickens. In short, most experts agree - raising and keeping chickens isn't cheap, and you're not going to save money compared to buying eggs at the market. Dan Quigley, Clinton Township's Code Compliance Officer, requests that you first be mindful of the regulations (that actually helped ease restrictions on raising chickens). Governed by Franklin county, the Regulation of Agriculture, ZON-13-02, section 115 provides the specifics, including a Fact Sheet: [Microsoft Word - Adopted Chicken Duck Rabbit Amendment Effective 8-8-2013 \(franklincountyohio.gov\)](#).

Franklin County Engineer's Office continued work with the design consultant (Proudfoot and Associates). Plan review comments were recently provided for a 50% design submittal and the consultant is currently addressing them. The plan is to have the final design complete by the end of April 2023 and to bid the project early to mid-Summer with a completion date by the end of 2023.

Clinton Township's Free Drive-Thru Produce Market



Our Free Produce Market is held on the second and fourth Fridays of the month, from 4pm until 6pm (or until we run out of

food!). There are no income requirements, however an i.d. is required. Enter from Brandon Street to drive-thru the rear of the firehouse. When available, Naloxone (Narcan) and fentanyl test strips will also be offered. In addition, we are always seeking volunteers to come help out!

These past 6 months, we averaged 12,617 pounds of produce and 499 individuals served monthly!



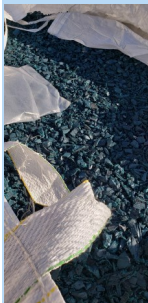
The Clinton Township Food Shack

Generously donated to us from the Krio Descendants Union out of necessity when the Food Fridge (which was provided by our fire fighters) could no longer stand up to the elements, The Food Shack is open to all those in need 24/7 and for donations as well! Donations can be canned or boxed, (unopened please), and other items such as rice, beans, and even toiletries such as toothbrushes, toothpaste, toilet paper, soap, etc. New or gently used clothes are also welcomed.

Spring Activities for Public Works

Superintendent Dave Medley of our Public Works Department is sharing some great news, tips, and reminders with everyone: "In keeping with our Beautification theme, we will be detailing our township parks to include replacing the playground mulch with tons of brand new blue rubber mulch and borders. The rubber mulch has been made of recycled materials and because it is not organic, it won't attract pests and inhibits the growth of weeds. In addition, it requires little to no annual maintenance such as re-mulching. However, the biggest advantage is safety as the six-inch cushion will provide a safer surface for children in these play areas."



Many of you have taken advantage of those seventy degree winter days preparing your yards and pruning away! Our brush chipper (Chippy) will be making the rounds starting **April 3rd. Please be sure:**



All brush is placed near the road with the cut ends pointed toward road



Tree limbs and small trees should be left in one piece (easier to feed) with a maximum of 8 ft long/6 in diameter



Do not tie your brush bundles with anything—this will cause damage to Chippy!



Ensure there is no debris or trash of any kind mixed in the bundles including no roots



Yard waste such as grass/hedge clippings, weeds, vines, must be bagged and put out for trash pickup
