Fire Department News

As we each continue to respond to the COVID-19 pandemic, your fire department is continuing our mission to protect lives and property. We have been in regular contact with health organizations, other public safety agencies, and our medical directors to make sure we are following best practices to protect our firefighters and the community we serve. If you are feeling ill and believe you are experiencing COVID-19 symptoms (e.g., cough, fever, difficulty breathing, or body aches) contact your doctor and follow their instruction. If you do not have a doctor, please call the Ohio Department of Health at

1-833-4-ASK-ODH. If you call 9-1-1 you will be asked questions regarding COVID-19 symptoms. Please advise the dispatchers of any symptoms you may have. When the paramedics arrive, they will ask the same questions. The paramedics will have on gloves, a mask and goggles. This is to protect both the paramedic and the patient. They will also give you a mask to cover your mouth and nose prior to any treatment.

We will get through this by working together. During this time, we have seen many residents helping each other. Please continue to check on your neighbors. Our seniors over 60 years of age and those with underlying health issues are more vulnerable to COVID-19 and should stay home as much as possible.

Brush Collection

This is a friendly reminder that brush pickup has begun and will run through September. Please pile brush neatly at the curb with the butts of the branches toward the road. Weeds, leaves, roots, etc. should be placed in yard waste cans for Local Waste pickup. Please do not include roots, stones or other debris in brush piles, these damage our chipper and delay service.

Changing Weather

As heavier rains are becoming more frequent, we are experiencing more street flooding. Especially in the spring, the storm water grates get covered or blocked with debris causing minor flooding. Please do your part to prevent street and personal property flooding by clearing your property of any debris that can wash into storm drains. Please call (614) 471-1479 if you see a clogged grate.

Car Break-Ins



While it may seem like a minor annoyance to make a report, it enables us to see patterns of crimes as they emerge. With the rise of opioid additions in Franklin County, we tend to see a rise in car break-ins (and shoplifting) so remember to keep all valuables out of your car.

Code Compliance FAQ's

How else can we help?

- We must work with Franklin County Economic Development and Zoning to report and enforce all of the zoning regulations except trash cleanups and inoperable vehicles.
- We must work with Franklin County Public Health on specific health related matters, such as, unsanitary living conditions.
- We are happy to assist you in contacting our county partners so you are able to reach the appropriate department as needed.

When a case is opened, how long does it take to resolve?

• This is difficult to answer. Most cases are resolved quickly once a notice is received or contact has been made. Others may need to move to a second Certified notice and where applicable, action by the Board of Trustees when authorized. The entire process can take weeks to months due to scheduling. Should an issue be handed off to Franklin County, who then works with the Prosecutor, cases can take upwards of 6+ months to even be scheduled due to varying case loads.

How do you normally get reports?

We observe items during routine patrol, and can action anything we observe from the right of
way. We can also action items observed from adjacent property, should we be invited to the
adjacent property to observe. Lastly, we receive calls and emails from the residents reporting
items they have observed, we then investigate.

I Just Moved Here, How Do I Setup My Trash Services?

• We partner with Local Waste Services. Give them a call at (614) 409-9375 to setup service. Trash service is required for all properties in the township!

I Have A Lot To Dispose Of Or A Large Item, What Should I Do?

 You will need to arrange bulk pickup. You must call Local Waste at (614) 409-9375 to schedule the pick up.
